Celebrating the Advent Season

<u>Memorize</u> **Luke 1:45:** *Blessed is she who has believed that what the Lord has said to her will be accomplished!*

ADVENT: The arrival of something important or awaited.

The advent of the Christmas season is upon us. As you think about the coming of Christmas what thoughts and emotions does that stir within?

As believers we know that Christmas is the time set aside to celebrate the coming of Jesus to earth as a man, born as a baby. It is a time God has given us to commemorate His goodness and grace in sending us what we need ~ a Savior! From the moment sin entered the world back in the garden of Eden, mankind has needed Christmas. In this study we will participate in the celebration of the Christmas Advent.

<u>Background:</u> Within the church the term Advent actually has three meanings: (1) the coming of the Lord in the flesh at Christmas; (2) His arrival in Word and Spirit; and (3) the final Advent when Jesus will return bodily in glory. The celebration of Christmas Advent begins on the fourth Sunday before Christmas. Because Christmas falls on different days each year, Advent can last 22 to 28 days. To celebrate Christmas Advent five candles are needed. During each Sunday's observance of Advent a new candle is lit, until on Christmas Day all five candles are lit. Our study will utilize the following sequence:

- Week One: The Prophecy Candle ~ Period of Waiting
- Week Two: The Bethlehem Candle ~ Symbol of Preparation
- Week Three: The Shepherd's Candle ~ Sharing the Good News
- Week Four: The Angel's Candle ~ Proclamation of Love
- Christmas Eve/Day: Christ's Candle ~ Adoration

As you begin, <u>pray</u> that the Holy Spirit will enable you to understand in a fresh way the depth of God's love for you, His beloved!
